


TO STUDY AT IPU IN JAPAN

Summary of Application Guidelines








## Duration of the programme

20 to 22 weeks (approx 5 months)





# **Eligibility**

- i) Non-native speaker of Japanese currently enrolled at IPC
- ii) Japanese competence equivalent to Japanese-Language Proficiency Test Level  $2^*$ 
  - \*If you have at least Level 6 (600-Level) proficiency in Japanese, you are encouraged to apply.
  - \*Applications from students with Level 5 (500-Level) proficiency in Japanese will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- iii) Wishing to have IPU credits cross-credited to two (2) papers or more
- iv) Willingness to learn Japanese language and culture, and to participate in sports/cultural activities
- v) Satisfactory attendance and grades at IPC
- vi) Satisfactory work ethics towards study as well as on-campus activities and events
- vii) Preferably completed a Trinity TESOL Cert or equivalent, or majoring in Language Studies or TESOL

## Cross credits

The credits obtained from IPU classes will be cross-credited to up to four IPC Japanese papers. For details please discuss with your Dean at IPC prior to your applications.



## Assistantship work

You will be required to carry out assistantship work

- Assisting IPU students to develop their English skills
- Participation in all activities and projects that strengthen the link between IPC and IPU
- Participation in IPU events and functions (e.g. Open Campuses, Sports Festival, Kanta-sai Cultural Festival, Christmas Party)
- Teaching English at local primary and secondary schools and participation in local activities for international cultural exchange
- Writing of reports on your study experience in English and Japanese and completion of questionnaire for improvement of this exchange programme; these will be made available to IPU & IPC staff

#### Japanese public health insurance

Note: This compulsory Japanese insurance covers 70% of your medical costs but does not offer any other benefits that New Zealand travel insurance would provide (e.g. evacuation expenses, travel changes, personal liability, baggage and personal items). It is recommended you also have your international travel insurance.

# **Application procedure**

### Written applications (Stage I)

To apply, please submit your application form to IPC Administration by the closing date (see the programme schedule).

- i) Completed application form
- ii) Essay (details to be advised)
- iii) Letter of recommendation from your IPC lecturer(s)

### Interviews, essay and Japanese test (Stage II)

- i) Interviews\*
  - \*The students who are selected after the review of their application forms will be invited to an interview at IPC in English and then a TV interview with IPU in Japanese. Their grades and attendance record to be provided by IPC to IPU in advance.
